

Open Space

At least daily in the second half of the month of March, I would hear from someone that they couldn't believe Easter was just around the corner. It seems an early Easter doesn't help

one to pay attention in Lent. Life seems to blow by too quickly.

So here we are in April, with two full months before the summer is upon us, and my prayer for all of us is that the time stretching before us feels like open space. Spring Break has happened. Easter Sunday has ushered us into the season of Eastertide. We have confidence the snow and ice storms are behind us for the Spring season. And we have two months, nearly 9 weeks, with a Mother's Day holiday in six weeks and a 3-day Memorial Day weekend to round us out. What might we venture into? How can we explore beyond our usual haunts? Who will we get to know better? Where will God lead us? What we will learn in these days?

Entering April with an open heart and mind is an invitation to all of us. We could choose the opposite, to keep our heads down, to cling to our agendas, or to rush from one thing to the next. But an early Easter gives us space after the Great Resurrection Sunday to take some time

to listen and pray and ponder.

To get at this invitation another way, consider the plight of my friends who recently planned a glorious European anniversary trip ... only to have a medical emergency on the day they were to depart. Once their health was restored, I received an email a week after their intended departure describing how the sudden change of plans became an opportunity rather than a disappointment. They wrote, "As a consolation, we have these more spacious days to feel some relief and to move slowly, continuing to hold these two weeks with an intention for a more contemplative pace. Between showers I've had long walks on our road while the earth is, indeed, resurrecting."

I love this sense of open hands and receiving hearts to what God offers us. In April worship servies of Eastertide, as we listen to the first responses to resurrection, may we hear how God finds us. As Chris preaches on the loaded idea of expectations, may we see God's hopes for us. As we let the children lead us to Christ, may we see the steadfast love of God through their trusting eyes.
