

WALKING WITH WISDOM

We do love our history at The Old Scotch Church. Part of that love is about the story in the past. People have marvelous stories, if we will just take the time to listen. Part of it is about drawing strength from history, as people who see and expand on what's happened before. Part of it is the wisdom we can find in history when we stand in the position of hindsight to make better choices, because we are ever-hopeful to mature and grow. Our Old Testament history is part of who we are today as people of the Christian faith. When we walk through that history, we gain a

pathway to God's wisdom for us today.

With the start of the Fall season, our study of Old Testament history continues to work through the prophets. This fall, we explore the exile to Babylon. Over ten years ago, we started this Fall focus of listening to the Old Testament with Abraham's life. We followed his line of children into Egypt, and then Moses led us out. We've walked with the Kings, probably spending the most time with King David, who is centrally featured in Old Testament history. We raced through the wild kings of the Northern and Southern split of the People of God into Judah and Israel. Then, we took a look at some of the prophetic voices who walked with the kings before Israel split into two kingdoms and then those with the Northern tribes, whether the kings listened to them or not. We've heard from familiar prophets like Isaiah and Ezekiel as well as from minor prophets.

To start September, we'll hear from the little-known prophet Obadiah before we take the rest of the season to listen to the prophet Jeremiah, who started a hopeful ministry with King Josiah, who was a reformer. Then his ministry became tougher with almost every king, because Babylon was gaining power and momentum as King Nebuchadnezzar led Babylon toward Israel. Jeremiah tried a number of approaches and used many metaphors to help the people turn toward God. Even as he was taken into exile, he kept reminding the people that they were God's people. Even in the midst of exile, he gave them the true and comforting words that the steadfast love of

the Lord never ceases and God's mercy never comes to an end.

So, as we walk into the cooler days and up-tick of activity that September brings, remember that we are part of a long history of God's work in the world and that God is always, always working in our lives, speaking to us through whatever means we might listen ... even through a prophet.

As you prepare for worship each Sunday, here are the texts, themes and events for September.

North Plains Food Bank and Volunteering

The "Kickstart2school" event was a success and free of charge to all participants. Here's a summary provided by Alan Hallberg:

- There were ~300 kids that attended.
- All kids got personalized name tags, backpacks and many essential school supplies to fill their packs.
- 270 pairs of brand-new shoes were given away
- Countless clothes were donated to needy families and put to good use. Roughly ~50 large garbage bags filled with clean, organized clothes to choose from.
- Virginia Garcia Medical Center had 2 large vans on site for treatments: Vaccinations, dental exams and treatments and other medical services and connections.
- Vision to Learn and Lion's Sight and Hearing Foundation Screened 40 children and all 15 that needed
 - it went through VTL van full eye exams on site and referred to clinics for glasses. Both teams provided contact information for any further follow-up support. Eye screening was available to all, but only 40 chose to or knew they needed screening (they either just had exams, or already had glasses, and opted not to screen)
- July seemed early for this, but here we are now 3 weeks from school starting, and hundreds of kids now much more prepared for success.

The NPFB is planning to move on August 26th. The FB will not be closing. A small building directly across 314th St is being rented. In addition, a shed is being purchased to hold fridge and freezers. Longer term a mobile trailer may be placed on the length of this grassy lot that is part of the property. The FB supplies and demands continue to grow, 4000lbs of food serving over 300 families, almost 2000 clients fed on a weekly basis.

The NPFB will be open to moving help during the week of 8/26-8/31 when they are to be completely moved out.
