

### WALKING WITH STEADFAST JEREMIAH

In September, after a splash into the rather obscure book of Obadiah, we started our fall study of Jeremiah the prophet as he spoke to God's people who were heading into being conquered and exiled. As we learned from his call story, being a prophet is a hard call. Yet God promised Jeremiah, and us, to be equipped and never without God's presence. Then we heard echoes of Jesus as the Living Water when Jeremiah helped us to consider the ways we built broken vessels on our own instead of going to the Source of Life. Finally, Chris Macfarlane walked us into the power of prayer in one of the many prayers Jeremiah says.

October will be full of more of Jeremiah's trademark imagery as he uses everyday items to point us to the work and purposes of God. Jeremiah is repeatedly faithful to following God in a chaotic world where leadership is lacking and the enemy is drawing ever closer. Jeremiah's boldness and steadfastness are handholds for us in the winds that seek to blow us off course. We are God's people called to follow the ways of Jesus. May we listen for the tools God is offering through the prophet Jeremiah.

Besides worship and sermons, we have the opportunity to learn and grow through the 9AM Sunday School class in rooms 1 and 2. For Sept. 21 and 28, Jean Nevills, who is a Spiritual Director, led us into an exploration of what it means to walk with God's Holy Spirit. We hope to hear more of her teaching in the Spring. In this month, Brian Kinnear will prepare us for the basics of Bible Study on Oct. 5 and 12 and I will be leading class on Oct 19 and 26 for a conversation around how we move from the Biblical text into modern situations we are encountering today. Please consider making time for these learning opportunities.







# **Thoughts Behind the Timber and Tradition**

In a heartfelt presentation during the Aug. 31 worship service, member Loren McConnell unveiled his newly crafted pulpit at the Old Scotch Church — a meaningful step in the congregation's ongoing renewal. Following the church's 150th anniversary celebration in 2023, restoration efforts have continued with repaired windowpanes, a new roof, fresh paint and now a pulpit built to honor both tradition and longevity.

McConnell designed and constructed the pulpit over a two-year period. It features Gothic Revival elements that echo the sanctuary's architecture, including arch-top panels that mirror the church's windows. Remarkably, the walnut wood used for the pulpit and the baptismal font beside it — also created by McConnell — came from the same locally harvested tree. The tree was donated by his parents decades ago and saved for a worthy project.

Beyond its craftsmanship, the pulpit was dedicated with a message about its deeper purpose: to serve as a spiritual anchor for the congregation. Drawing inspiration from Herman Melville's vivid description of a ship-like pulpit in *Moby-Dick*, McConnell emphasized its role in guiding, replenishing and uniting the community. He offered three guiding principles for its use: speak truthfully, trust that God's message will be heard and be a good listener.

The pulpit, he reminded attendees, is not just a fixture but a vessel for shared faith, reflection and growth. As the congregation gathers around it in the years to come, it will stand as a testament to enduring craftsmanship and collective devotion.

Thank you for the gifts of the people, given to your glory, and in your Son's name, our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.


