

ON GRATITUDE

I can get a little sucked in during November. It's not that Christmas appears the day after Halloween. It's not how many days off school there seems to be. It's not all the variety of crafts one can do that resemble a turkey. I get sucked into the emphasis on gratitude. There are the gratitude journals or the post of what someone is grateful for or the touchy-feely commercials as

Thanksgiving approaches. Every November, I want to up my gratitude game.

So, I'm wondering what it is that motivates gratitude? A quick online search of 'thank' in the Bible lands me with 169 references. As I wander through these, most reference the goodness of God. God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit always seem like a good place to start! Perhaps in this month, we look to pay attention to the ways God is good to us. Attentiveness to this one aspect gets us out of the way and focuses on our Source. We like to take credit for so much in our lives, but let's trace it back a few steps further to consider who gave us the energy or personality or health or brilliant mind to do the great things we are so thankful for!

That dependence on God as our Source also cultivates a humility in us. We realize we are less in charge than we think, yet because God is at work, we have an avenue for peace. We realize we are less important that we imagined, but the love of Jesus still redeems and renews us. We realize we are not the catalyst to make things happen, which opens us the freedom to wait, to receive and to watch for the Holy Spirit on the move. With humbly depending on God, we can take our eyes off of ourselves and see the ways God is good. May that goodness lead us to give thanks.

On the worship front, November is full of chances to praise and worship God! We wrap up our fall study of Jeremiah when the people of Judah land in Babylonian exile, where Jeremiah does the hard work of offering hope to the broken and bewildered. The last day of November is also the first Sunday of Advent, where we begin our Advent series with Hope. Beyond our Sunday morning worship, we are also offering our annual Service of Remembrance on November 9 at 3 PM, which is a peaceful, hopeful service before the holidays begin to remember loved ones who have died. Consider coming to give thanks for a loved one. Or perhaps invite someone who would appreciate some reflection time for their losses. This special service is a comforting way to lean into the Lord's presence.

As you prepare for worship each Sunday, here are the texts and themes for November.

What's Happening with Missions

Alternative Christmas Gift Giving for 2025

Each of us is blessed with bounty. We do not have to go to bed hungry each night like 1 in 11 people in the world do. With the approval of the Mission committee and our Session, as Mission elder I am pleased to present to you four alternative gifts you can give as presents this Christmas to loved ones or donate to share your bounty.

The four groups we chose to support for 2025 Alternative Christmas gift giving are:

- 1) For local Mission child focus: Northwest Children's Outreach
- 2) For local Mission youth focus: Home Plate Youth Services
- 3) For local Mission family focus: North Plains Food Bank
- 4) For World Mission focus: Rise Against Hunger

Northwest Children's Outreach is a Christian-based volunteer organization that collects and distributes basic resources like diapers, formula, toys blankets clothing to underserved children in the Beaverton, and Portland community. In 2022 they served 15,777 children through their distribution centers.

Home Plate's Mission is to support youth in Washington County experiencing homelessness. Over 5,000 youth have been served this year. They listen and counsel youth, provide meals, clothing, a safe place to do laundry, take a shower, nap or do homework. Your donation will go to support Home Plate, above and beyond the monthly third Thursday night meals we currently purchase, prepare and provide.

North Plains Food Bank supports low-income families (over 800 people) with food, grocery needs, and other financial support for basic needs. Currently, they do not get support from the Oregon Food Bank. Non-food items such as toiletries can be purchased at a special rate from local stores. North Plains Food Bank appreciates the bags of non-perishable groceries our church provides each week.

Rise Against Hunger is an international hunger relief organization founded by a United Methodist minister 25 years ago. They coordinate packaging and distribution of food and other aid to people in developing nations and people in need around the world. Our goal is to sponsor another intergenerational food packaging event next Fall in coordination with other Presbyterian churches. Your donation will go towards the purchase of the food and supplies for the next event.

We will be collecting donations beginning the Sunday after Thanksgiving, December 1, through December 22, downstairs at the Faith in Action Table. We ask that donations be \$10 and up, and you can donate to any or all of the organizations. You will receive a gift tag for each donation.
